JOHNSON COUNTY'S SECONDARY ROADS SYSTEM

(Data based on 2019 IADOT published values)

Roads

- The department is responsible for roughly 916 total miles of Secondary Roads
- Broken down by surface type:

Dirt	Gravel	Bituminous/Chipseal	Asphalt (HMA)	Concrete (PCC)
41	573	122	130	50

- We maintain approximately 316 economically crucial Farm-to-Market road miles
- Roads are designed to last 30-40 years between total reconstructions
- We manage over 1830 miles of roadside vegetation and ditches
- Maintenance and rehabilitation projects hold things together between reconstructions
 - Overlays
 - Mill and fill
 - Patching
 - Crack sealing




JOHNSON COUNTY'S SECONDARY ROADS SYSTEM

• Bridges


- We monitor 211 Bridges/Culverts longer than 20 feet included in the NBIS
- All bridges >=20 feet in length are required to be inspected at no less than 24 month intervals
- Of those 211 NBIS structures:
 - 28 bridges are structurally deficient (SD)
 - 3 are functionally obsolete (FO)
 - Only 2 fracture critical (FC) bridges remain on our system, one (P-20-1) is in this program.
- We are aggressively replacing and repairing deficient bridges as part of this CFYP
- Johnson County bridges rank very well compared with most in Iowa, although Iowa struggles with a low ranking nationwide due to the sheer number of bridges on the system
- Bridges are designed to last 50 years or more although many of our bridges are centenarians

• Thousands(!) of cross-road and driveway culverts <20 feet


(Expenditures By Calendar Year – 2022-2026)

(Revenue/Expenditures - Average Values – All Sources - Calendar 2022-2026)



- Gravel surface sealed with MC-3000 and 1/2" Graded Aggregate (Otta Seal)
- Repairable, self-healing, durable surface that minimizes dust

Full Reconstruction Phased – Grade & Pave Example - Proj.# STP-U-3715(668)--70-52

- HWY 218 to Hebl Avenue (~1.5 Mi.) ~ \$5.1 M Total, \$1.4 M FM funding joint project with Iowa City accomplished over two construction seasons
- 22' HMA pavement widened to 32' wide (4' paved shoulders added each side)



UTAH AVENUE STRUCTURE I-33-I

Bridge replacement with RCB Example – Proj.# L-I-33-I--73-52

- Over a branch of Rapid Creek ~ \$225k
- Load limited, NBIS bridge replaced with single reinforced concrete box culvert (RCB)
- Old bridge remained in service during construction on dead-end road
- Grading eliminated guardrail and improved hydraulics
- New RCB rated for SHV's & emergency vehicles





BLACKHAWK AVE NW STRUCTURE E-20-2

Bridge Replacement Example – Proj.# BROSCHBP-C052(123)--NC-52

- Over a branch of Clear Creek ~ \$600k. Roughly \$270k paid by competitive grant
- 24'w x 35' load limited bridge replaced with 30'-6''w x 70' CCS bridge





F36 (PUTNAM STREET NE) STRUCTURE I-9-I

Bridge Replacement Example – Proj.# FM-C052(121)--55-52

- Over East fork of Rapid Creek ~ \$520k.
- 22'w x 22' load limited bridge replaced with 30'-6''w x 30' CCS bridge
